About I-69

- In Texas, it follows existing routes: US 59, US 77, US 84, US 281 and SH 44
- I-69 is a national interstate from Michigan to Texas and partially completed in some states
- Completing I-69 Texas is a very long-term project
- All planning is conceptual right now


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I-69 is Driven by Texans

- Five citizen-led segments committees along I-69 Texas system; one advisory committee to oversee recommendations of entire I-69 Texas system
- Regular planning meetings to study and develop recommendations
- Each segment has its own transportation needs and challenges as well as common principles for I-69 development

Benefits of I-69 Texas


- Serves population and traffic growth
- Provides safer travel (bridges and overpasses, exit, entrance ramps)
- Improves emergency evacuation routes
- Maintains and improves economic development

- Existing highway footprints should be used for I-69 Texas
- Public input is vital
- Communities will benefit from I-69 Texas

- Encompasses portions of US 59, US 77, US 281 and SH 44

- Encompasses portions of US 59, US 77, US 281 and SH 44.

Segment Four Priorities

(Conceptual and preliminary ideas)

- US 77 Priorities
 - Improve to interstate quality south of Lyford to Willacy/Kenedy County line
 - Relief Route at Riviera
 - Improve to interstate quality Willacy/Kenedy County line to south of Riviera
 - Improve to interstate quality north of Riviera to south of Driscoll
- US 281 Priorities
 - Relief Route to serve US 59 and US 281 at George West
 - Improve to interstate quality north of McAllen to south of Falfurrias
 - Relief Route at Premont
 - Improve to interstate quality Brooks/Jim Wells County line to south of Premont
- Designate as I-69 existing freeway sections that meet interstate standards





Segment Five Priorities

(Conceptual and preliminary ideas)

- US 59/SH 44 Relief Route at Freer
- SH 44 Relief Route at Alice
- US 59 upgrade and connector from the border to east of Laredo
- SH 44 Relief Route at San Diego
- US 77 Relief Route at Odem
